Our 100 year celebrations are fast approaching and the students and staff at BVPS are excited.

We need your help to make this day a success.

We would like to show and highlight our achievements and successes over the timespan, therefore we need items that you may have at home that we can borrow for the day. It is surprising what you or your family may have that others would love to see and reminisce over.

The students of Berkeley Vale are busy this term learning about the history of BVPS. Students have been amazed to hear about the way our school has changed over the last 100 years, Students are learning about similarities and differences, and comparing the present with the past.

Lessons include:

- Exploring the history of BVPS using a selection of sources including photographs and data.
- Using oral histories to tell us about the • past. Students looked at a case study of our oldest known ex-student and what school was like in the early days when she attended. Children will also ask their elders what school was like for them.
 - Learning about how BVPS has changed over time – size, location etc.

School Facts

Berkeley Vale Public School was first known as Tumbi Umbi School.

When the school opened in 1915 it operated on a part- time basis with teacher, Mr Dagg, also teaching at The Entrance Public School. Tumbi Umbi School was first located on a site between Wyong Road and Shannon Parade, now called Berkeley Vale Old School.

The school began with an estimated enrolment of 12 students.

Berkeley Vale Public School at Pindarri Avenue was officially opened in October, 1979.

Changes to First Aid Procedures

New policy developments from the Department of Education in relation to First Aid have been implemented in all NSW public schools recently. These changes have included:

- Mandatory completion of first aid plans by doctors for students requiring medication at school including asthma and anaphylaxis; and
- Limitations in treatments provided to students

These changes are being implemented at Berkeley Vale PS this term and we thank all parents in regard to understanding and acknowledging these changes. If you have a child who requires medical attention at school due to a medically diagnosed allergy or ailment then you need to have a first aid plan completed by your family doctor or physician as soon as possible for any medications to be given to your child.

The other change that has been implemented is the treatment offered to students in relation to everyday issues. Our wonderful office ladies will not be able to apply any ointments or creams for injuries obtained by students. This includes antiseptic creams like Savlon and anti-sting treatments like Stingose. The limit to treatment will be water, cleaning a wound with an antiseptic wipe, and applying a bandage or band aid. This is due to the amount of students who may have a reaction to the products used to treat injuries. Child safety, health and wellbeing is very important to our staff and we will continue to contact parents in the event of an injury that we feel requires additional attention.

Thank you for your understanding of this change in our daily operations at school.
